IOBC Editors' Panel: Call for Proposals - January 2nd 2018

Are you working on an OB related research idea? Would you like to discuss your work with major scholars in the field?

The 4th IOBC will be held at the Collier School of Management, Tel-Aviv, Israel on January 3rd – 4th, 2018. The pre-conference Doctoral Consortium, will be held at the Technion – Israel Institute of Technology on January 2nd, 2018. As part of this consortium, we will be holding an Editors' Panel. In addition to providing valuable tips on how to get a paper published, the Editors' Panel provides an excellent opportunity to discuss your research in an informal, collegial roundtable setting. Each roundtable will have a facilitator to give feedback on 2-3 early-stage research papers, allowing plenty of time for discussion. Regardless of whether you are a senior or a beginning researcher, this workshop offers you an invaluable opportunity to receive detailed feedback from scholars serving as editors or on the editorial boards of top journals. Whether this is your first major research project or your fiftieth, this is a chance you won't want to miss!

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Your submission should include the following four sections:

- I.** Brief abstract (not to exceed 150 words) and four keywords
- II.** Overview of research (not to exceed 2,000 words)
 - Research topic
 - Conceptual framework
 - Research questions
 - Method
 - Anticipated contributions to research/practice
 - Key findings (if research is complete)
- III.** Challenges (the areas on which you would like to focus discussion) (not to exceed 250 words)
- IV.** References

1. Learning from experience of leading academics

The first session will host leading scholars from Israel and abroad that will share with us their career stories. They will describe their career development route, career choices they made, complex decisions they had to make along the way, dilemmas and turning points. They will also share the times and places when they experienced thriving, as well as points of regrets. The scholars will also share with us what they had learned from their chosen route and what recommendations they may have for younger scholars. Through these career life stories PhD students and junior scholars will be able to gain insights into the life course of academics and into dilemmas and decisions that have to be made along the route. The session will also open up to questions and answers.

2. Skill oriented round table: Leading scholars will hold round tables on major skills needed in the academic world:

1. Publishing - Considerations of how best to publish your research: finding the right platform, choosing publishing strategy, dealing with reviewers
2. Planning your post doc
3. Writing research grants
4. Establish professional networks
5. Finding the golden path between academic career and family
6. How to Survive and Thrive During Your First Years in a Tenure-Track


Students and scholars will have 2 opportunities to choose tables to discuss these topics. In each table we will have two scholars. One from Israel and one from abroad
