About the Host University

The first thing you should do is download the <u>Campus Group App</u>; each group\club\initiative is posted there. It is the main tool for knowing what's happing around the campus and the best way to be part of the amazing social life that is offered. Note: on Thursday evenings all Stern's students meet in a local bar for drinks and mingling - don't miss it.

Regarding your career: you should create an account in the Stern Life site, then meet with a consultant in order to adjust your CV and start applying for internships or jobs. The Career Center is oriented to Stern's full time MBA students, but you can still use it to find great opportunities if you approach them as early as possible at the beginning of the semester.

It is hard to find an internship opportunity in Finance\Strategy areas, because the MBA students secure their internships during their first year, but tech opportunities are always available.

Another great way to meet people is by joining student clubs, which promote different subjects and host great events and conferences in topics from Tech and Entrepreneurship to Wine tasting and Sports.

Courses and Professors

• Communication Management, (Ronni Burns) - must have course!

Improving presentation abilities, social skills and communication in the business environment. Each presentation you do is recorded and you receive feedback. By the end of the course, you will have a useful reflective view of yourself that could help you achieve your life\career goals.

Prof. Ronni is one of the best professors I had during my MBA studies.

Accommodation

- Try to rent an apartment in downtown Manhattan, near Greenwich.

Visa

J-1: The visa <u>allows you to work</u> in the USA, and you can stay an additional 3 months after the visa ends.

Transportation

I lived downtown and close to the university, so I walked most of the time, or I used the subway or Lyft.

If you are living in a central location, don't purchase the monthly unlimited MetroCard, just load money according to your needs.

Insurance and Health Services

Iso Insurance: Try to convince the NYU insurance department to use Israeli travel insurance which is better.

Living expenses

I spent around 15K NIS per month.

Tips

- Go on the exchange experience as early as you can (beginning of the academic year) in order to secure an internship\job\other programs.
- Think about how the exchange experience can advance your career path. Just taking classes is not enough. Think of a plan before arriving.
- Try not to enroll in classes on Thursday nights, as a lot of social activities and events take place during those hours.
