The 2020 Canada/Israel Exchange Program presented by The Gerald Schwartz & Heather Reisman Foundation offers you:

- Approximately 2 weeks in Canada (Halifax and Toronto) and 2 weeks in Israel
- Meetings with Canadian and Israeli business leaders
- Education on Canadian culture and business practices
- Airfare, hotel, ground transportation, and entrance fees fully covered
- An exciting chance to study abroad

If you are interested in meeting new people, experiencing a new culture, and visiting historical places, then the Canada/Israel Exchange Program is for you. You have the opportunity to stop at wineries in Nova Scotia, Ontario and Israel for wine tastings, visit popular landmarks such as Niagara Falls, kayak in the Atlantic ocean, visit the place with the highest ocean tides in the world, float in the Dead Sea, and ride camels in the middle of the Judean desert.

How much will the program cost me?

The program is almost fully funded by a donation from The Gerald Schwartz & Heather Reisman Foundation. TAU students will pay only a Cdn\$500 (approx. 1390 NIS) registration fee after acceptance into the program. Airfare, hotel, transportation, entrance fees to all of the events, tour guide fees, and **selected meals** will be covered by the donation.
