- Ranked among the most selective by U.S. News and World Report
- History
- Brandeis University was founded in 1948 by the American Jewish community at a time when Jews and other ethnic and racial minorities, and women, faced discrimination in higher education.
- Brandeis' visionary founders established a nonsectarian research university that welcomed talented faculty and students of all backgrounds and beliefs. From the outset, Brandeis focused on undergraduate education, while building a pioneering research enterprise.

Brandeis IBS: Analytical

Graduate Exchange Programs – International Business School



- ***Exchange Eligibility***
- Be an enrolled student at a partner exchange institution as a candidate for a Masters level degree in **Business, Finance or Economics**.
- All exchange students must have a high proficiency in English
- Nominations come directly from home institution. Home Institution is required to attest to student English level (min 100 TOEFL or C1 proficiency).
- Access to Careers Strategies Center, Academic Advising and Clubs

Student Life – Exchange Students



- Housing
 - No on campus housing for Graduate students
- Health Insurance
 - Students must enroll/purchase Brandeis Health Insurance (Visa regulations)
- Orientation
 - All exchange students have an orientation to help them adjust to life at Brandeis

Boston: The Advantage

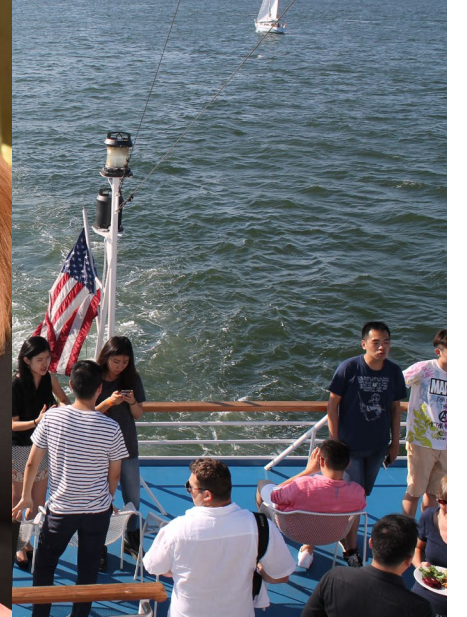
- Vibrant center for financial services, high technology and consultancy industries

Costs
