NEW ECONOMIC MODELS

SPRING

This course focuses on different levels of the economy. It will train students to the specificities of a new economic model that allows the combination of economy, ecology, and meaning, while integrating the technological and sociological changes of this new century. The new managerial and organizational models leading to the regenerative economy will be the heart of the course.

AUTUMN

Supply chain management can be described as the design, operation, and improvement of the supply chain, from source to end-consumer. With the evolution of globalisation, the fit between the strategy of the firm, its marketing target and the supply chain designed to support it will be at the heart of the class. A Louvain edX online course will also support its operation.

CULTURAL MANAGEMENT

This course is designed to develop crossculturally competent and responsible leaders. The central aim of this course is to develop the capacity to understand and analyse management situations that international organisations face with regard to cross-cultural management and leadership. The course will focus on the impact of culture on individuals, teams and organisations; on how to deal with cultural issues in a responsible way and still be efficient and effective in business.

As part of its International Business Major, LSM offers intensive courses targeted at MBA students. These courses are condensed on very short periods of time. Two are available in spring: "New Economic Models" and "Cross-Cultural Management", while the "Block Seminar in Supply Chain Management" is taught in autumn at the beginning of September. Each course is designed to offer the most active pedagogy possible to the students: guest speakers, case studies and online modules will all be part of the pedagogical methods of learning used by our teachers.

Evaluation methods vary depending on the course but can include: written exams, individual papers (during or after the course has ended), group presentations, oral exams, etc. and the final grade often rests on a mix of different evaluation types.
